Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

Ambulance Vehicle Maintenance and Daily Readiness Checks

1. Purpose

To outline standardized procedures for **ambulance vehicle maintenance and daily readiness checks**, ensuring every ambulance is safe, fully functional, and ready to respond to emergencies efficiently.

2. Scope

This SOP applies to all ambulance vehicles and personnel responsible for vehicle checks and maintenance within the organization.

3. Responsibilities

Role	Responsibility
Ambulance Crew/Driver	Carry out daily vehicle and equipment checks, document findings, and report issues.
Maintenance Supervisor	Review checklists, arrange repairs, and oversee scheduled maintenance.

4. Procedure

1. Daily Visual Inspection

- o Inspect vehicle exterior for damage or fluid leaks.
- o Check windows, mirrors, lights, and sirens for cleanliness and function.

2. Fluid Level Checks

o Check and top up fuel, engine oil, coolant, brake, and windshield washer fluids as needed.

3. Tire Inspection

o Check all tire pressures (including spare) and tread condition. Inflate/replace as needed.

4. Interior & Equipment Check

- Inspect and test emergency medical equipment (defibrillator, suction, oxygen, etc.).
- Ensure all essential supplies and medications are present and in-date.
- Ensure seatbelts, interior lights, and communication devices are functional.

5. Cleanliness

· Check cleanliness of interior and exterior. Clean as required to meet infection control standards.

6. Documentation

- o Complete the Ambulance Daily Readiness Checklist and log all findings.
- Report any issues or deficiencies immediately to supervisor or maintenance.

7. Scheduled Maintenance

o Adhere to manufacturer maintenance schedules (oil changes, inspections, servicing).

5. Documentation

All checks must be recorded on the Ambulance Daily Readiness Checklist and kept on file for review.

6. Compliance

Any failure to perform daily checks or report maintenance issues will be treated as a breach of protocol and may result in corrective action.
