Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

Pre-cleaning Preparation and PPE Usage

Purpose:

This SOP details the procedures for **pre-cleaning preparation and PPE usage**, including the identification of cleaning tasks, selection and inspection of appropriate personal protective equipment, proper donning and doffing techniques, workplace hazard assessment, and ensuring a safe environment prior to cleaning activities. The goal is to minimize exposure to harmful substances and maintain worker safety by adhering to standardized preparation and protective protocols.

Scope:

This SOP applies to all personnel involved in cleaning activities within the facility.

Responsibilities:

- · All staff must comply with this SOP.
- Supervisors are responsible for ensuring availability and integrity of PPE and for overseeing compliance.

Procedure:

1. Identify Cleaning Tasks

- Review the cleaning schedule and specific areas/items to be cleaned.
- Note any tasks that require special attention or enhanced PPE.

2. Conduct Workplace Hazard Assessment

- Assess the environment for potential hazards (e.g., chemical, biological, physical, and mechanical risks).
- o Document identified hazards and communicate them to all personnel involved.

3. Select Appropriate PPE

- Choose PPE based on identified hazards and task requirements (e.g., gloves, gowns, goggles, face shields, masks, etc.).
- Refer to the PPE selection matrix or guideline, if available.

4. Inspect PPE

- o Thoroughly examine all PPE for tears, holes, cracks, degradation, or contamination before use.
- Do not use damaged or expired PPE; report and replace as necessary.

5. Donning PPE (Putting On)

- Perform hand hygiene before donning PPE.
- Follow the correct sequence for donning (e.g., gown → mask/respirator → goggles/face shield → gloves).
- Ensure PPE fits securely and comfortably without gaps.

6. Prep Work Area

- o Remove unnecessary items or obstacles from the immediate work area.
- Ensure adequate ventilation and lighting.
- o Confirm the availability of cleaning supplies and emergency equipment (e.g., eyewash station, spill kits).

7. Doffing PPE (Taking Off)

- Remove PPE following established protocol and sequence to avoid contamination (usually gloves → goggles/face shield → gown → mask/respirator).
- Dispose of used PPE in appropriate waste containers.
- Wash or sanitize hands immediately after removing PPE.

8. Documentation and Reporting

- Document completion of pre-cleaning preparation and PPE checks.
- Report any incident involving PPE failure, exposure, or near-miss to a supervisor immediately.
