Equipment Exteriors	Wipe with damp cloth, avoiding electrical components unless specified as water-resistant.	Equipment-safe cleaner or disinfectant
High-Touch Surfaces	Wipe thoroughly, allow disinfectant contact time as directed. Pay attention to handles, switches, etc.	Approved disinfectant

- After cleaning, rinse surfaces with clean water if required (check product instructions).
- Use clean cloths or disposable towels for rinsing.
