SOP Template: Standardized Gift Measurement and Cutting Guidelines

This SOP details **standardized gift measurement and cutting guidelines** to ensure consistent sizing and precision in gift preparation. It covers the tools required, step-by-step measurement techniques, accurate cutting methods, quality control checks, and safety protocols. The goal is to maintain uniformity, enhance presentation, and reduce material waste during the gift wrapping process.

1. Purpose

To provide a standardized process for measuring and cutting gift wrapping materials, ensuring high-quality, uniform presentation and optimal use of resources.

2. Scope

This procedure applies to all staff involved in the gift wrapping process where standardized sizing and presentation are required.

3. Tools & Materials

- Measuring tape or ruler (metric and imperial)
- · Sharp scissors or precision cutter
- · Cutting mat (optional for safety)
- · Pencil or washable fabric marker
- · Gift wrap paper and decorative materials
- Adhesive tape and ribbons
- Protective gloves (optional for safety)

4. Measurement Guidelines

- 1. Place the gift box/item on a flat surface.
- 2. Measure the length, width, and height of the gift.
- 3. Add a standard overlap margin (usually 3â€"5 cm or 1â€"2 inches on each side) for seamless wrapping.
